Young Dreams Academy in Epworth, Zimbabwe

ABCA sent Pastor Alex Dewa four boxes of books. Pastor Alex was so happy with the books that he decided to distribute them to four different schools instead of just the one school. These schools are struggling because the kids can't speak English and can't read because they don't have reading books.

The first school to receive ABCA books was Young Dreams Academy in Epworth. Epworth is one of the poorest communities in a high-density area in Harare, Zimbabwe. Young Dreams Academy is a charity school for orphans and underprivileged kids, and there are 150 kids at the school. The school doesn't have a library and most of the kids cannot read because they do not have access to textbooks or reading books. The school is now making sure that each kid gets a reading book. The school thanked ABCA for the blessing of supporting the school, and really appreciate the donation of books.

Pastor Alex said in a voice note to ABCA: "We want to thank you so much for the books. We look forward to working with Australian Books for Children of Africa in making a difference in the lives of our children. This partnership is going to change lives. It is going to improve the reading culture of these children in high-density places. It gives them hope and the capacity to read. If someone can read, he can rise. We appreciate it so much. Thank you."









Jompani Primary School - Zimbabwe

ABCA books were delivered to Jompani Primary School, in Sanyati Kadoma Village, Zimbabwe, by Pastor Alex Dewa.

Jompani Primary is a charity school located in a poor community that depends on farming for survival. The school doesn't have a library, and they were very happy to receive books from ABCA as they say the students will now have an opportunity to read books and study. It is wonderful to see how engrossed the students are in the books!

Orengo Primary School, Kenya

The school is located in Bondo, Siaya County, and is a sister school to Rona School of excellence. Both are run by the Rona Foundation. Lourdes Primary School, Soweto

Lourdes Primary School in Soweto have a library with very old books. The school is very concerned about the number of children throughout the school who are reading below standard, particularly post-Covid. They are determined to focus on encouraging reading in the foundation phase classes so that this issue is resolved going forward.

The school was extremely happy to receive much-needed books from ABCA to improve their library and help with their reading program. The photos were taken in the media centre and in their new reading garden.







Bags for Beginnings Project (Johannesburg)

ABCA are very happy to have contributed to the 'Bags for New Beginnings' project of The Union of Jewish Women in Johannesburg. These bags are gifted to new mothers who don't have any items for their newborns when giving birth at government clinics and hospitals.
